REFUND POLICY

(This refund policy DOES NOT include Trips, PDCC, Afterschool or Summer Day Camp)

Refund of fees and charges paid for the participation in recreational activities shall be made under the following conditions:

CANCELLATION OF ACTIVITY BY THE DEPARTMENT

Persons registered for a program which is cancelled by the department shall receive a full refund of fees, or a fee credit for a future program, whichever the registrant prefers.

PARTICIPANT CANCELLATION DUE TO ILLNESS OR INJURY

Persons canceling their registration due to circumstances such as illness or injury, which prohibits participation in the registered activity, shall receive a full refund of fees or a fee credit for a future program, whichever the registrant prefers. Fee refunds shall be prorated from the start of the program to account for lapse of time and classes attended. Participant has 60 days from time the program begins to request a refund. *Doctor Note Required.*

PARTICIPANT CANCELLATIONS

Persons canceling their registration prior to the registration deadline shall receive a full refund of fees or a fee credit for a future program, whichever the registrant prefers. Canceling after the registration deadline the registrant will receive a refund minus a \$10 service charge. Participant has 60 days from time the program begins to request a refund.

CANCELLATION OF PARTICIPANT IN LEAGUES AND TOURNAMENTS

Entry fees for team and individual participation in leagues and tournaments are not refundable or transferable after the schedule is prepared.

TRIP REFUND POLICY

No refunds will be given, unless your space on the trip can be filled. If a waiting list exists, RCPR will contact those on the waiting list to try and fill the space(s). If no waiting list exists or those on the waiting list no longer want to participate in the trip, it will be the responsibility of the participant to resell their space(s) on the trip. In many cases, the department must make pre-purchases; therefore, this refund policy is not flexible. NOTE: the \$10 cancellation fee will apply, even if the space is filled.

THE WEEDLESS GARDEN - HYDROPONICS

Dr. Ray Schneider has spent summers since the mid-1990s creating hydroponic gardens to pursue his interest in tomatoes. He is also a contributing editor to The Growing Edge magazine. From the Greek, hydroponics means literally "water works" and is a medium-less method of growing almost anything. Schneider has been growing cucumbers, jalapeno peppers and tomatoes using Nutrient Film Technique, which works by flowing water containing plant nutrients down plastic channels to a tank and then pumping the nutrient back to the top of the channels. This talk shows you how to do it and describes the adventure.


