LARGE LAND BOOK AND COMPLETE INDEX

The 19th Day of December, 1820.

To lay of(f) the several Publick Roads in this County into fit, and of s'd Precincts, and also to allot the hands to work on s'd precincts, made, ordered to be Recorded and it is further Ordered that Henry Moyers to the Brock's Gap road as Nominated, by said Herring, and the hands the several Surveyors so allotted to the said precincts by the commissioners (?) work thereon as the Law directs, and that any Overseer heretofore made to and the same is hereby rescinded, which Herring is as follows:

Of Rockingham ----- Court, 1820, appointing the Commissioners (?) to go and precincts and to appoint Surveyors and male Labourers to each the different sections of said county and acquired all the information each road, I have numbered each precinct of said road, saying is written the Surveyor's name, and in the second opposite his name leave where the precinct begins and ends under which is written Lotts and Tenaments from which the Labourers are to in Order --
